## BBC Sports Personality of the Year 2021



Capping off a brilliant 2021, Kent's Emma Raducanu has deservedly won BBC Sports Personality of the Year. Having thrilled the nation by reaching the fourth round at Wimbledon, Emma far exceeded that by winning the US Open and, in doing so, became the first qualifier to win a Grand Slam singles title.

Finishing the year as world number 19, the world's media voted Emma as WTA Newcomer of the Year. Now the British public have voted Emma as only the third British female tennis player to be awarded BBC Sports Personality of the Year, and the first since Kent's Virginia Wade (in 1977).

Well done to Emma – we look forward to seeing her progress in the years to come!

## Kent's unparalleled success in Winter County Cup



Records were broken as Kent's Ladies and Men's teams both became National Champions at the Winter County Cup this month. Kent Ladies became the first team since 1969 to win 5 years in a row, whilst Kent Men became only the second team to win both Summer and Winter County Cup as well as the Men's 35s County cup in the same year.

The ladies' remarkable 5th consecutive win, was captained again by Holly Richards, and supported by Vice-Captain Jacqueline Darby, as they beat Hampshire, Middlesex and Northumberland. The players were Alice Gillan, Nell Miller (who didn't drop a set all weekend), Sofia Johnson, Gabby Chidwick, Sarah Wray, Olivia Parson and Tabitha Howe.

The men were captained for the final time by Andy Burgoyne. Andy is the most successful Kent captain now, standing down after 13 years in the role, and having won 5 County Cups. Andy is also the only player to have represented Kent on over 200 occasions. What a great way to end his captaincy by leading Kent to both Summer and Winter national titles this year (in the same year he played in Kent's Mens 35s national win too). Kent Men beat Yorkshire, Essex and Lancashire. The players were Anton Matusevich, Jack Pinnington Jones (who, on his debut, didn't drop a set all weekend), James Davis, Matt Summers, Nick Brookes, James Markiewicz, Matt Short and Hugo Coquelin.

Well done to all of Kent's players this year, who, at all levels, have applied the ethos and spirit required to compete in county team tennis, battling hard on the court for their county. Thank you - the Garden of England is in full bloom!
