Kent County Tennis Championships 2022

As usual, the last week of school summer holidays brought the flagship tournament in Kent, the County Championships. Bromley Tennis Centre provided the venue for the week long event, with matches taking place for up to 13 hours each day. Entries were up by over 20% on 2021 with 358 entrants across 27 events ranging from 8U to Open.

The week ended with a busy finals day where Sebastian McDonnell-Palomares and Chloe Cleaver triumphed as Boys and Girls Singles County Champions (18U winners) for the first time, beating Angus Howard and Darshani Popat respectively. Chloe completed a double when winning the Girls 18&U Doubles partnering Anais Gauthier.

Mention and congratulations must also go to Iris Grosso, who was the only player to win more than one singles event, being victorious in the Girls 10U and 11U Singles beating Olivija Konstantinova in both finals. Other people to collect the winners' trophies for two events (including at least one doubles) were Alexis Chastang, Matthew McLain, Isabel McLain, Alessia Popescu and George Diable.


The largest entry was in the Men's Singles with 59 players competing in matches all taking place after 6pm. The event was won by Joe Young who played brilliantly all week, losing only 8 games in his 5 matches. Alessia Popescu was nearly as dominant winning the Ladies Singles without dropping a set.

Congratulations to all the winners and losing finalists. They kept a big crowd entertained all day with some excellent tennis in the finals.

The qualifying events scheduled for the weekend before at other venues around the county were cancelled due to a lack of entries. Next year we will look to make changes to encourage more entries. Please do let us know if you have any ideas that would help persuade you or your children to enter.

2022 saw the first learning disability events held in our County Championships.

A particular mention goes to Chris, who is stepping down as Lead Referee after 12 years, transforming the tournament into one of the most successful county championships in the country, with entries rising to over 400 (the record being 440 in 2017). Thank you to jdm Estate Agents who sponsored this event for the first time, and also, our thanks go to Bromley Tennis Centre for being excellent hosts and partners, in the running of the tournament once again.

Kent Men, as holders, came so close to repeating the glories of the past two summer competitions, and finished as runners-up by the tightest of margins. They won their first four matches, including a convincing win over eventual champions, Hertfordshire, but lost 5-4 to East of Scotland in a very tight, high quality match, played in great spirits on the final day. Well done to captain Alastair Filmer, vice-captain Sean Thornley and the rest of the team (Nick Brookes, Lewis Burton, James Davis, Ben Gusic-Wan, James Markiewicz, Francis Sargeant and Matthew Summers).

Kent Ladies found themselves hampered by illnesses and injuries this year,

both before and during the week. In a tough division, also won by Hertfordshire, after battling well, they were regrettably relegated to Group 2, with hopes that in 2023 a swift return to Group 1 will be achieved. Finally, congratulations to Ben Gusic-Wan who beat Richard Whichello's 40 year record and became Kent Men's youngest ever county cup player at 14 years and 8 months.

Junior County Cup Boys win 2 more National Titles

Having started the year with Kent's Boys 18U team becoming national champions, the Boys 10U and Boys 9U teams both won their qualifying groups and went on to become national champions.

The Boys 9U were very impressive winning all their matches in the national (south) finals comfortably - very impressive indeed! Well done to captain Tom Samson, vice-captain Lucy Morice-Jones, and players Henry Harrison, Lewis Kefford-Watson, Harrison Mirrington, Matyas Oprchal and Jake Spooner.

The Boys 10U had dominated in all their matches to reach the national final, and then came up against a strong Yorkshire side whereby they won through on a final shoot out to be crowned national champions. Congratulations to Captain Brett Spencer-Stephens, Vice-Captain Sam Smith and players Darnay

Hunnygen, Tony Keohane, Eoin Lambourn, Matyas Oprchal, and Luke Pratten.

Overall, as well as 3 national titles, our junior teams did us proud with a further 6 teams finishing runner-up in their qualifying groups.



Peter Stotesbury (1937-2022)



It is with It is with the greatest regret that we inform you that Peter Stotesbury passed away on 19 September at the age of 85, following a lengthy illness.

Peter was probably best known to Kent Tennis Officials as a Kent Tennis Councillor of 21 years from 1989 and sat on the Kent Men's Selection Committee for 34 years from 1975, being awarded his Honorary County colours in 1997. He was also the Kent Men's Fixtures Secretary for 18 years – aiding three successive (and successful) Kent Men's Captains Charles Bailey, Paul Bourdon, and Richard Whichello. He was a kind, softly spoken gentleman whose enthusiasm for the sport of tennis was enormous, and his wise counsel was often sought out by his peers. Peter was awarded the County Lifetime Achievement Award in 2017 for all his work both at Parklangley and for the county; the LTA were so impressed with his work, he won the LTA Regional Award too.

Peter also played to a good standard, representing Kent's Veterans Mens over-45s team in 1984 and 1987, as well as being Kent Veterans Men's 45s Doubles Champion in 1986. He continued playing right up until last year when illness finally prevented him stepping onto court.

Peter was inextricably linked with The Parklangley Club; his grandmother was a member (winning their Ladies Singles soon after the club started in 1911) and his father, Donald, (also a Kent Tennis Councillor, of 24 years), mother Eileen, brother Mike (who played for Kent Men in the early 60s), wife Diana, and all his children (Nicola, Tim, Alison and Julia) played at the club. Peter was Tennis Captain in the 1960's, first team captain at Squash, and played Badminton, whilst also becoming Chairman and Director of Parklangley Freeholds Ltd.

Outside of tennis, Peter was a devout Christian, becoming a lay preacher in the church, a keen Rotarian, an enthusiastic walker, and a lover of wine. Our thoughts and sympathies are with Peter's wife Diana and his family at this challenging time.
