The County Championships is one of our flagship events and the week is the busiest week in the competitive calendar right across the Country, with more players competing during this week than any other during the year.

In 2023, we introduced an Inclusive Tennis Festival (for players with disabilities) and we are hoping this year to attract even more players from all over the County to take part and enjoy this event on Sunday 25th August.

New this year is Padel and we are pleased to be able to hold our first ever County Championships in this ever-growing version of tennis at The Sundridge Park Club on 24th and 25th August.

Once again, we are very grateful to Bromley Tennis Centre (BTC) for hosting our Tennis Championships which is scheduled to take place from 25th August onwards culminating in the finals being held on 1st September. Jason Baker will be the Lead Tournament Referee and Graham Silvester is the second Tournament Referee whilst Sarah Langford will once again take on the role of Tournament Director on behalf of BTC and Siobhan Butler is the Tournament Co-ordinator from Kent Tennis.

Finals of all events will take place on Sunday 1st September with the exception of the red event which will be completed in 1 day.

DOUBLES

Subject to age restrictions, players may enter a maximum of TWO consecutive singles events, ONE same gender doubles event and ONE mixed doubles event. Please remember that players entering four events may be asked to play up to four matches a day. *Sign in for entry at the Control Desk.*

The Doubles deadlines is Monday 26 August at 6pm. Doubles events take place from Wednesday 28 August – Sunday 1st September

In the event of bad weather or any other circumstances beyond our control, the Referee may alter the day or timings and/or the match scoring format. This may mean adopting abbreviated scoring.

KENT TENNIS

What do we do?

As the governing body for tennis in Kent, Kent Tennis supports clubs, coaches, officials, parents and volunteers to open up tennis to people of all ages and abilities, providing opportunities for playing, training and competing.

As a charitable organisation, Kent Tennis is led by a Board of Trustees with a number of committees reporting into the Board, all of whom are volunteers. The volunteers are helped by an Office Team who look after different areas of Kent Tennis.

Our mission is to transform communities through tennis, making tennis relevant, accessible welcoming and enjoyable. We work with a range of partners across Kent and the London Boroughs of Bromley, Bexley, Lewisham and Greenwich to deliver a range of opportunities and encourage people to become involved in tennis as a player, coach, official volunteer or just a fan!

Whilst an important part of our work is to encourage people of all ages and abilities to pick up a racket and " have a go ", we also want to help facilitate people in achieving their potential and we organise and run a number of leagues and tournaments. Our Performance Manager, Craig Allen, also manages the performance programme for children throughout the County and arranges a number of open days throughout the year.

Our work involves:

- Organising Kent representative teams and county training of all ages from 8 & Under to Over 80s.
- Organising school tennis competitions and festivals.
- Seeking and managing sponsors.
- Working with the LTA South East Team to support Kent venues, coaches and officials.
- Organising Kent Inter-Club Leagues and supporting District Inter-Club League.
- Sharing news, initiatives, via a bi weekly Kent Tennis News.
- Managing the Kent Supporters' Club.
- Organising the Kent Annual Awards and making nominations for the LTA Awards.
- Offering interest free loans to clubs to improve facilities.
- Offering coaches a support network.

- Organising Annual County Championships for various age groups and abilities.
- Organising inclusive festivals and events.
- Maintaining essential records and producing an Annual Review and honours boards.
- Offering financial support to increase diversity and inclusion.

We run regular monthly virtual coffee mornings where a range of topics are discussed and have over 2,200 subscribers to our Kent Tennis News.
