Kent's players have had a successful summer, with international wins for Ben Gusic-Wan representing GB 16U Boys in the Tennis Europe Summer Cup, and titles for our Seniors in the British Closed Masters Grass Court and ITF Masters events.

Over 2000 players from 51 clubs across the county have been competing in <u>Kent's</u> <u>HEAD Inter-club summer leagues</u> and the finals take place on 9 and 10 September.

The tournament season finished on a high with the Kent County Championships at the end of August, with nearly 400 players competing in over 800 matches from 8U through to adult categories, plus an Inclusive Tennis Festival to open the Championships and our 2023 Junior Awards and County Colours presentation to close the week.

The Inclusive Tennis Festival for players with disabilities was the first event of the 93rd County Championships, attracting players of all ages from across Kent, including a former GB paralympic table tennis player. One rally during the fun, friendly

afternoon generated over 300 shots, and all the players received a medal and certificate at the end.



KENT SENIORS COUNTY CUP UPDATE
